For manuscripts including information or clinical photographs relating to individual patients (living or deceased), where those patients could be identified by readers in any way, written and signed consent to publish must be obtained from the patient, legal guardian, or next of kin. This requires that the patient(s) be shown the manuscript prior to submission.

Patient Consent for Publication of Material in CJO

Manuscripts will only enter the *Canadian Journal of Ophthalmology (CJO)* review process once the signed consent form has been received by the editorial office. Please photocopy this form as required.
